
Dear Mr. Tobin:

On March 27, 1990, the Installation Restoration Program Manager for Camp Lejeune was contacted by Mr. Kevin Boyer, Weston Site Manager, concerning the ABC Cleaners Site, Jacksonville, NC. Mr Boyer was requesting access to Camp Lejeune for the purposes of conducting remedial investigation/hydrogeological assessment for the ABC site. Limited investigations of the ABC site and the extent of the contaminant plume have revealed that ABC Cleaners has contaminated Camp Lejeune's water supply wells.

Mr. Boyer has requested to meet with the Installation Restoration Manager on March 28, 1990 to discuss the site background, obtain additional hydrogeological information and discuss the possibility of placing monitoring wells on Camp Lejeune to determine the extent of contamination from ABC Cleaners. In order for remedial investigative work to be conducted on Camp Lejeune, the Base will need a site access agreement with EPA. This agreement should include a discussion of the required monitoring wells to be placed on Camp Lejeune, the operation and maintenance of these wells and disposition of these well after all studies and cleanup have been concluded.
